

80+ NHS ORGANISATIONS JOIN MASSIVE LAUNCH OF 'HELLO MY NAME IS...' CAMPAIGN

More than 80 NHS organisations – comprising more than 400,000 staff who between them care for millions of patients – are joining a massive movement launched by a terminally ill doctor from the north of England. The collective, 'big bang' launch will happen on 2nd February.

The 'Hello my name is...' campaign was created by Dr Kate Granger, a young hospital consultant from Yorkshire who works in elderly care, to improve the patient experience not only here in the UK, but across the world. Kate became frustrated with the number of staff who failed to introduce themselves to her when she was in hospital. Her campaign, started on social media platform Twitter has inspired nurses, doctors, therapists, receptionists, porters, domestics and staff in all roles.

The campaign is simple – reminding staff to go back to basics and introduce themselves to patients properly. Kate talks about this as "the first rung on the ladder to providing compassionate care" and sees it as the start of making a vital human connection, helping patients to relax, and building trust. Feedback from patients across the country shows how vital this is to them, saying that the smallest things make the biggest difference.

The campaign is being endorsed by an increasing number of well-known figures including David Cameron, Jeremy Hunt, the Countess of Wessex, Bob Geldof and Drew Barrymore.

The first organisations to get involved in the mass launch were connected through adoption of Listening into Action (LiA)® - a radical programme developed by Edinburgh-based husband-and-wife team, Hannah and Gordon Forbes at Optimise Limited, to shake things up and get a *fundamental shift* in ways of working across the NHS. It focuses removing bureaucracy and empowering staff 'at the coalface' to improve patient care in their own areas.

The Mid Yorkshire Hospitals – where Kate is now working – are a Listening into Action (LiA) Trust and their own launch of 'Hello my name is...' was a catalyst. "We thought it would be good to invite other Trusts in the network to launch on the same day, and it spread like wildfire from there" says Hannah Forbes. The first Trusts signed up, and this momentum from this was used to 'fuel the spread' to a massive 80+ organisations within just two weeks, making this probably the biggest and fastest growing movement around improving patient care that the NHS has ever seen.

These Trusts are now collaborating, sharing ideas, and comparing notes as they go – forming a strong network which will massively boost compassionate care for patients across the UK.

Kate said: "I'm incredibly excited about bringing #hellomynameis to Mid Yorkshire Hospitals and even more excited about the collaborative launch of the campaign across the Listening into Action (LiA) network and beyond. I think the main messages from the campaign about high quality communication and always treating our patients as people with respect and dignity fit perfectly within the Trust's core values. I really hope my legacy will be exactly that, putting compassionate practice right at the heart of healthcare delivery every single day."

Hannah Forbes, one of the creators of Listening into Action (LiA)® and Managing Director at Optimise Limited says: "Kate's campaign is so important and we wanted to help. We work with a lot of NHS Trusts across the country. Inviting them – and others – to launch their own campaigns on the same day so there is a 'big bang' impact, and being able to connect them up so they can learn from each other just made sense. The way it has taken off is incredible".
